Official Rules and Regulations

1. Any unsportsmanlike conduct will result in immediate disqualification. ALL lake rules and restricted zones must be obeyed.
2. All boats must meet State of Illinois Coast Guard regulations & H.P. Limits.
3. All fish to be released.
4. Spinning and casting rods and reels only.
5. Only artificial lures may be used for bait. No live bait (minnows, crawdads, nightcrawlers, etc.). No trolling.
6. Team members will fish together.
7. **TAKE-OFF PROCEDURE WILL BE BY THE ORDER THAT APPLICATIONS ARE RECEIVED. FIRST APPLICATION FIRST TO TAKE OFF.**
8. Only Largemouth, Kentucky and Smallmouth Bass will be weighed. Bass must be 14 inches or longer in length and a limit of 5 bass per team. All fish will be measured on a flat bump board. NO courtesy bump. No frozen or mangled fish will be accepted for weigh-in. **ONE POUND** for any short fish will be deducted from total weight. Ties will be broken by a flip of the coin.
9. A late penalty of **ONE POUND** for each minute late will be enforced for checking in after official weigh-in time. A 10-minute late penalty will result in disqualification.
10. **TOURNAMENT OFFICIAL'S DECISIONS WILL BE FINAL ON ALL CONTROVERSIES.** Protests must be filed in writing within 15 minutes after weigh-in and signed by person or persons making protests.
11. NO boats will fish closer than 50 yards of an anchored boat.
12. **FOUR OUNCE** penalty per dead fish. Must have adequate live wells & kill switch.
13. **NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WILL BE PERMITTED IN BOATS DURING TOURNAMENT.**
14. At least one member of each team **must** attend the pre-tournament meeting at 6 p.m. Aug. 27, 2010, at Rend Lake Resort.
15. **Fee is \$200 per boat for those who register after 5 p.m. Friday, Aug 20.**
16. Life preservers must be worn when outboard motors are in operation.
17. Winners determined by highest total weight over 1 day for 5 fish.
18. Polygraph tests may be given randomly to top 5 teams.
19. No entry accepted unless entry blanks completely fill out (incomplete entry will be returned) and accompanied by check or money order made payable to: *Special Olympics Illinois*. Credit cards also accepted for entry fee.
20. Waiver must be signed onsite.
